

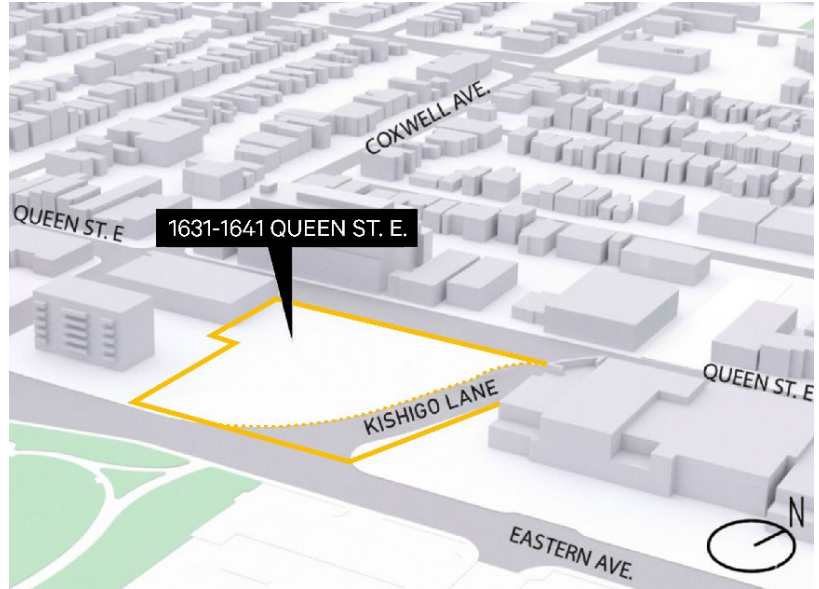
Community Meeting

1631-1641 Queen Street East

The City of Toronto is continuing work on the future mixed-income, mixed-use development at 1631-1641 Queen Street East.

The future development is proposed to include market and affordable rental housing, childcare, commercial space, and the development of Kishigo Lane – a publicly accessible open space named to honour an Anishinaabe family that lived in the area in the late 18th century.

Since the last community engagement, the City of Toronto has acquired 1641 Queen Street East, the adjacent property to 1631 Queen Street East. This provides an opportunity for a more complete development of the block and a better connection with Kishigo Lane.



Join us on October 22nd to learn about the updated proposal for the site, including changes made in response to previous community feedback.

The Community Meeting will be hosted by CreateTO, the agency responsible for managing the City's real estate assets, in collaboration with the City of Toronto staff from various Divisions. An Independent facilitator will assist.
