# Land Acknowledgment

Beginning with the forced removal of Indigenous Peoples and continuing through the implementation of anti-Black public policies and redevelopment practices, Atlanta is no stranger to the displacement of indigenous people and the destruction of African American communities. It is woven into the very origin story of our city.

We are on the traditional homelands of the Muscogee Creek and Cherokee Peoples. These Indigenous people were displaced through violence and governmental policies in the 1830s to make room for European settlers. Atlanta was built on top of thriving trade routes that connected Appalachia to the Sea and was home to ceremonial grounds and vibrant communities.

Our acknowledgement comes with responsibility. As we steward the land of the largest infrastructure project this city has ever seen, we recognize the historical trauma and continued displacement along with the great responsibility we have for ensuring equitable access to all the benefits the Atlanta Beltline has, can, and will bring to our communities.

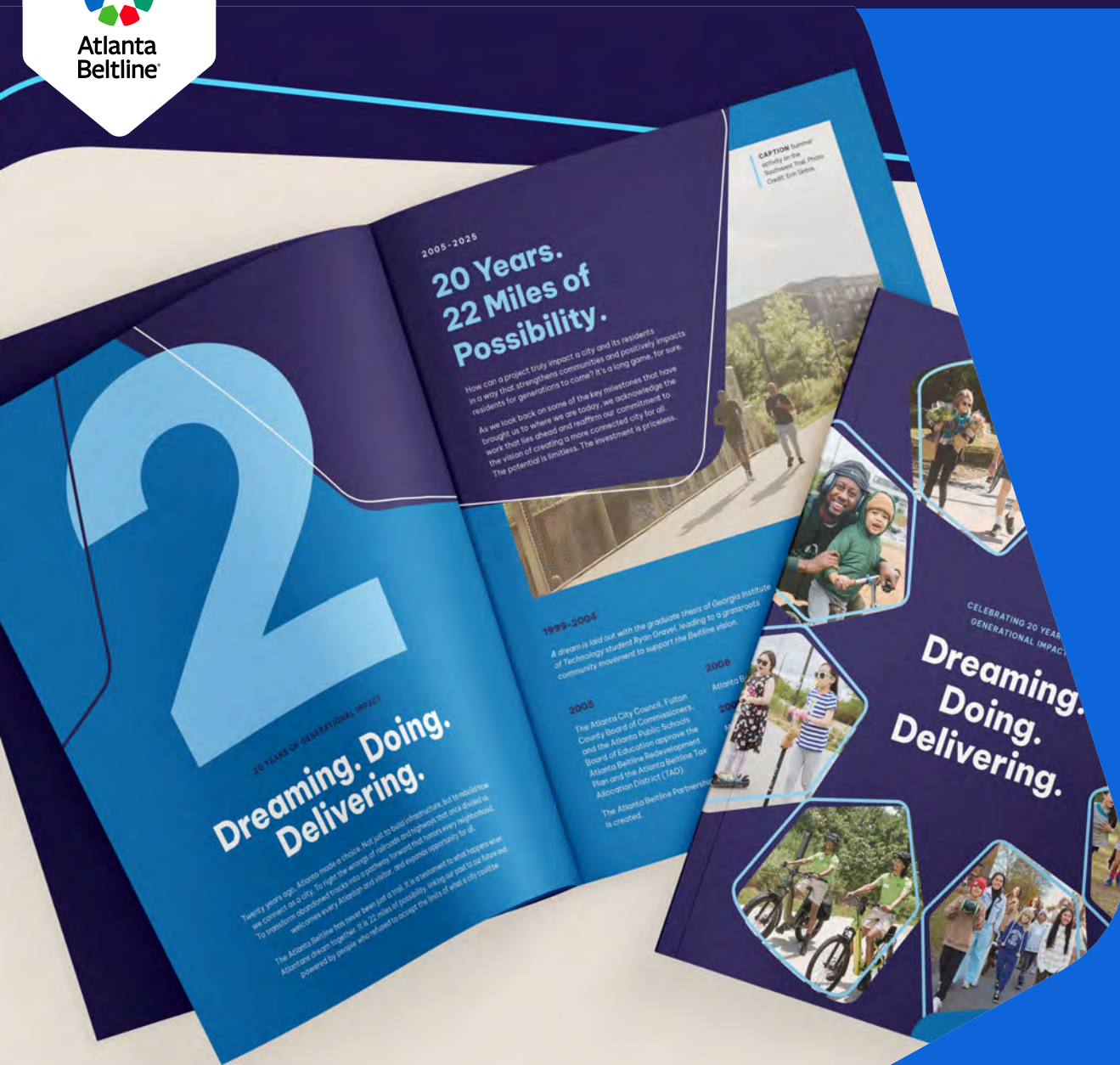

# Completing the Loop

- The 22-mile mainline trail is 78% complete with 16.7 miles of trail now open.
- Design is now complete for all segments of the Northern Arc, except for 0.3 miles where the trail crosses Peachtree Street.
- Two parks (Enota and the Bike Park) are under construction on the west side of Atlanta.



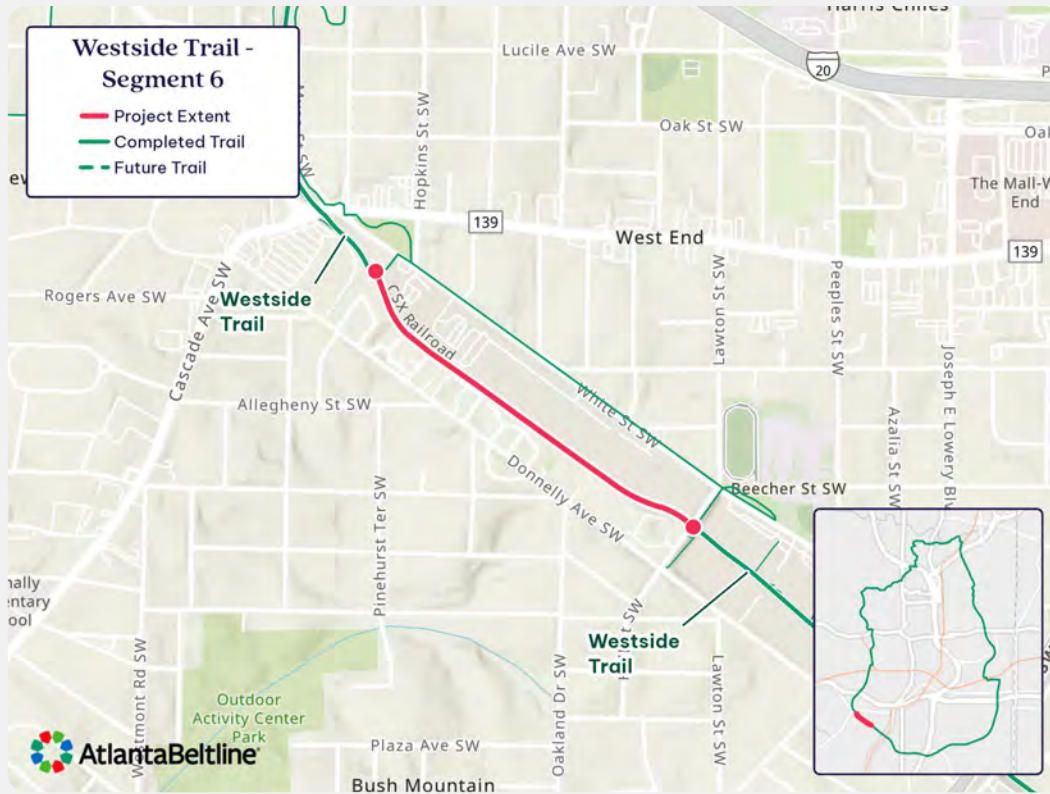

- Design 90% Complete



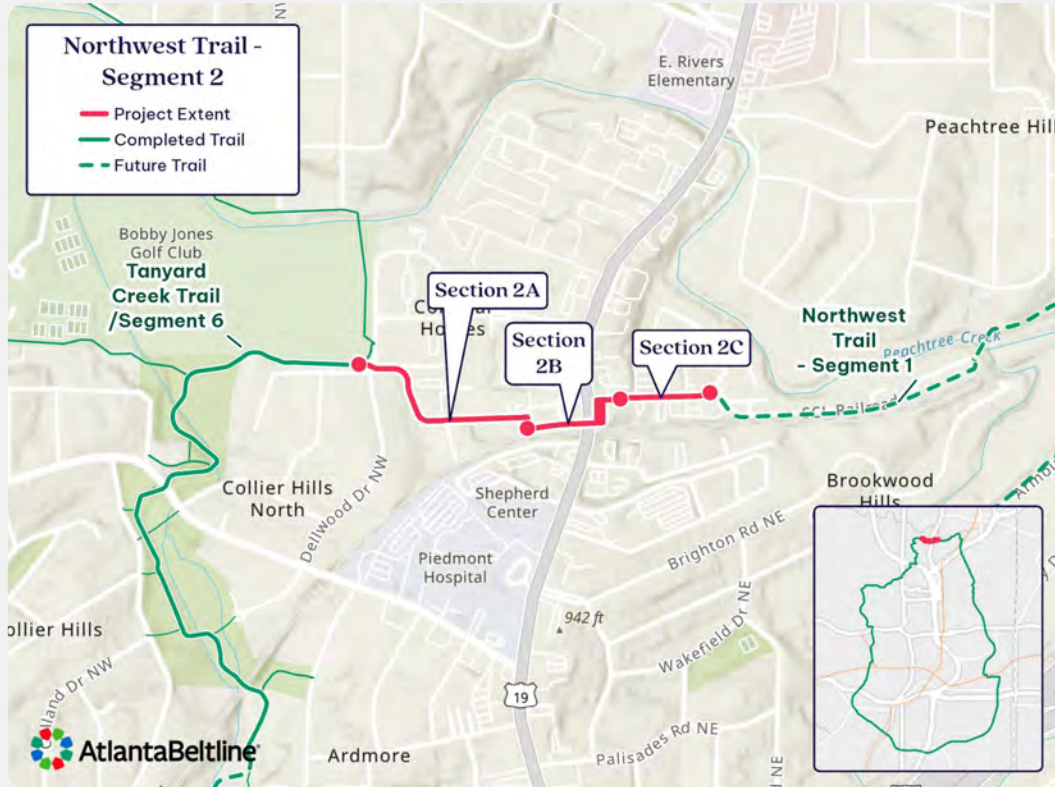
## Southside – Oakland Murphy Connector

- Design 60% Complete



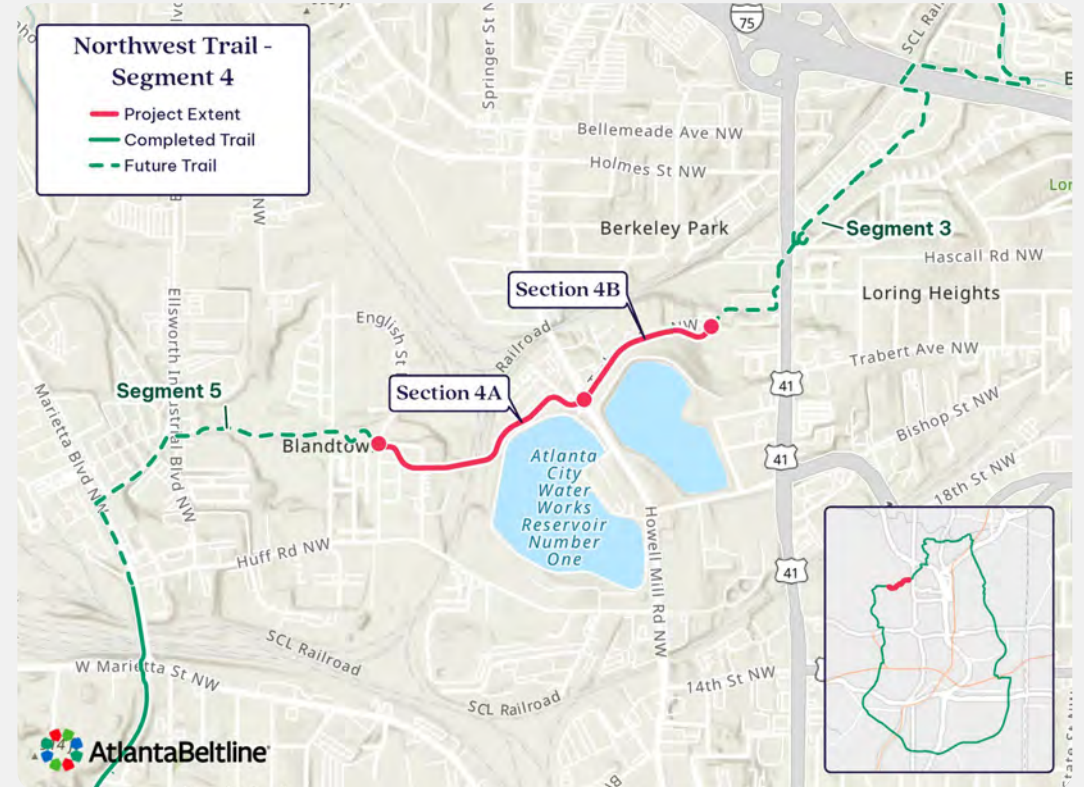

## Northwest Trail – Segment 2

- 0.7-mile trail from Bobby Jones Golf to Bennett Street, passing under Peachtree Rd. to Peachtree Park Dr.
- Section 2A and 2C will bid for construction in 2026.



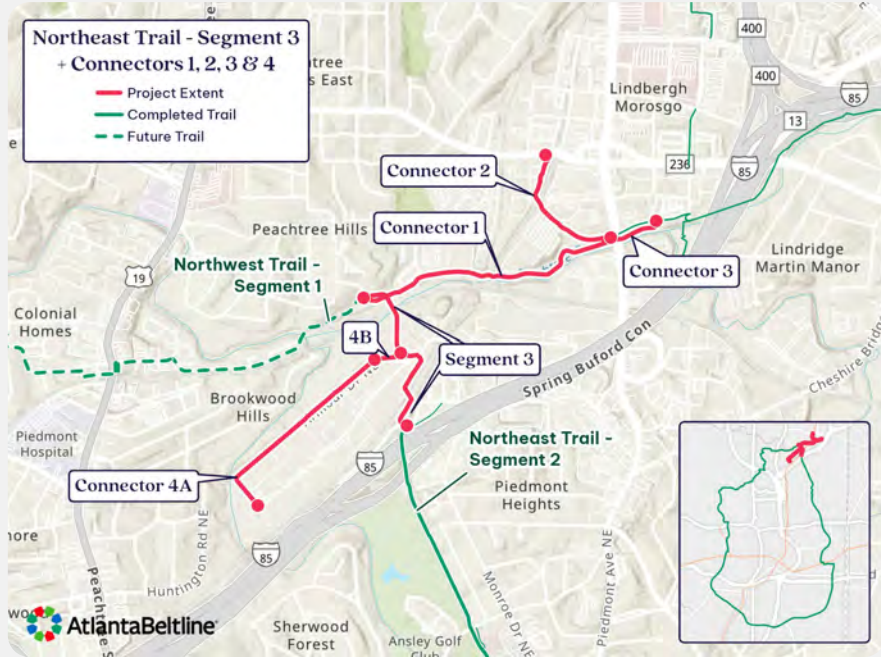
## Northwest Trail – Segment 4

- 0.9-mile trail from English and Culpepper along the City Waterworks, crossing Howell Mill to Trabert.
- Section 4B will bid for construction in 2026.

# Construction – Bid In Progress



## Northeast Trail – Segment 3

- 0.7 miles of elevated mainline trail from Buford Highway to Peachtree Hills
- Connector trails to PATH 400, Armour-Ottley, and MARTA Lindbergh
- Design, permitting, real estate and all approvals from GDOT to bid the project are complete
- Construction bid is in progress with bids due in June; anticipated schedule is 42 months.

- 1.9 miles of trail under construction from Boulevard to the I-75/85 overpass
- Concrete trail is complete. Lighting, cameras, railings and landscaping are in progress.

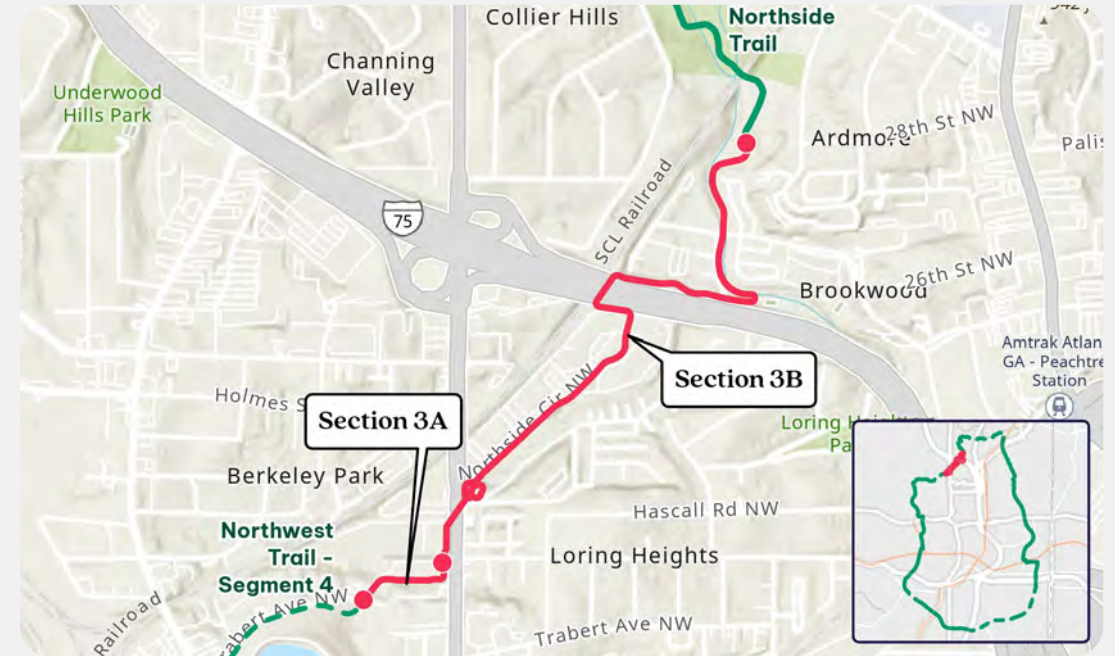
## Northwest Trail – Segment 1

- 0.8 miles of trail under construction from Peachtree Park Apartments to Kinsey Court
- Trail along Peachtree Park Apartments is complete and open. Bridge deconstruction and rebuild required across Peachtree Creek
- Target Completion: Q2 2028

- Project is under construction with work starting in November
- Target Completion: Q3 2027

- Boardwalk is almost complete, storm water and grading
- Target Completion: Q3 2026

- Shirley Clarke Franklin Park expansion from master plan – Phase 1 is under construction
- Phase 1, which is under construction, includes the completion of a pump track
- Target Completion Phase 1: Late Q4 2026, possibly stretching into Q1 2027

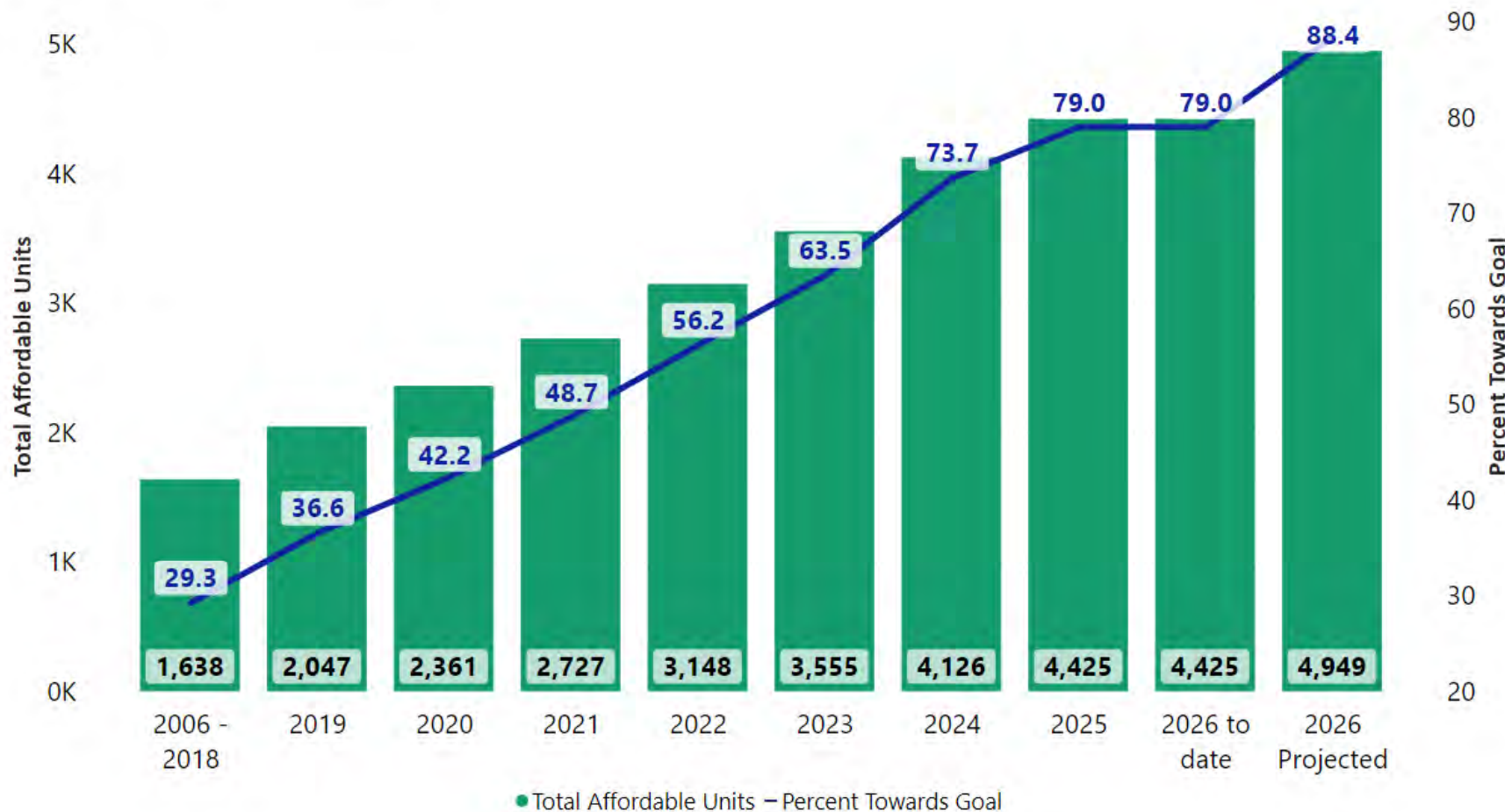

  - ~9,000 SF of Commercial Space
