



CANADIAN COUNTRY EXPO TERMS AND CONDITION DEFINITIONS

1.1 In this Agreement:

- (a) “Application” means the Canadian Country Expo Application to which these Terms and Conditions apply.
- (b) “Commission” means the commission that is stipulated in the Application.
- (c) “Deposit” means \$1000.00 per booth, such amount to be non-refundable.
- (d) “Event” means the exhibition event held at the Edmonton Expo Centre during the Operation Days, typically referred to as Canadian Country Expo.
- (e) “Exhibit” means the exhibit(s) and concession(s) the Licensee is operating at the Event, as indicated on the Application.
- (f) “Handbook” means the exhibitor handbook that is available through the Application.
- (g) “Licensee” means the person or entity indicated as the Legal Name on the Application and referred to as “Applicants” in the Application and the “How to Apply” document.
- (h) “Minimum Commission” means the minimum commission as specified in the Application.
- (i) “Edmonton Expo Centre” means the Edmonton Expo Centre.
- (j) “Edmonton Expo Centre Grounds” means all venue and land operated by the Edmonton Expo Centre including, but not limited to, that real property municipally described as 7515 – 118 Avenue N.W., Edmonton, Alberta for the purpose of the Canadian Country Expo event.
- (k) “Operation Days” shall mean those dates that fall within October 7, 2026 – October 11, 2026, inclusive.
- (l) “Rent” means the rent that is calculated in accordance with the Handbook.

1.2 Unless otherwise defined herein, all capitalized terms used in the Terms and Conditions have the meanings ascribed to them in this document.

GRANT OF LICENSE

2.1 When a Licensee submits an Application online by the deadline of August 1, 2026, the Licensee is deemed to have signed the Application. By signing the Application, the Licensee confirms that it has read, understands, and agrees to the Terms and Conditions.

2.2 When signed by the Licensee and the Canadian Country Expo organizers (the “Parties”), the Application together with the Handbook and these Terms and Conditions, are the license agreement for the rental of the Exhibit (the “Agreement”).

2.3 By signing the Application, provided that the Licensee pays the Deposit and Rent on or before May 1, 2026, the Canadian Country Expo organizers grant the Licensee a license, variable and revocable at will by the Canadian Country Expo organizers, covering the privilege (but not the exclusive privilege) of operating the Exhibit, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.



2.4 In the event of conflict between the Application, Handbook, and the Terms and Conditions, the Terms and Conditions will rule to the extent of the

3. PAYMENT

3.1 Payments made under this Agreement shall be made as follows:

(a) The Licensee shall pay the Deposit upon submitting their Application.

(b) The Canadian Country Expo will notify the Licensee of the status of its Application on or before June 1, 2026.

(c) If the Licensee is accepted to operate an Exhibit at the Event, the Canadian Country Expo organizers shall apply the Deposit against the Rent, and the Licensee shall pay the balance of the Rent on or before August 1, 2026.

(e) The Canadian Country Expo organizers are entitled to the Commission or the Minimum Commission, whichever is greater. The Licensee shall pay the Commission or the Minimum Commission to the Canadian Country Expo organizers as follows:

(f) The Licensee shall pay to the Canadian Country Expo organizers any amounts invoiced by them, including all taxes levied by lawful authorities, for additional costs incurred, directly or indirectly related to this Agreement, within thirty (30) days of the date of such invoices. The Canadian Country Expo organizers may deduct the full amount indicated on invoices from any monies of the Licensee held by the Canadian Country Expo organizers but reimbursable to the Licensee.

3.2 All fees and monies referred to in this Agreement are in Canadian funds.

3.3 All amounts payable under this Agreement are exclusive of any Goods and Services Tax ("GST") payable thereon. Any GST required to be paid shall be itemized separately on the invoice(s), if applicable. Nothing herein shall relieve any party of any obligation to pay GST under the Excise Tax Act of Canada.

3.4 The Parties understand and agree that the Licensee has no direct interest in or entitlement to payment whatsoever from tickets, including but not limited to commissions and surcharges, sold by the Canadian Country Expo organizers for the Event, including but not limited to general admission and gate passes.

5. OTHER TAXES AND DEDUCTIONS

5.1 The Licensee is solely responsible for all communications with the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) and all similar agencies regarding any applicable taxes.

6. TERM

6.1 The term of this Agreement shall commence effective on March 10, 2026 and shall conclude immediately upon expiration of the

Licensee's Move-Out (the "Term"), unless earlier terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Upon expiration of the Term,

this Agreement will expire automatically unless renewed in writing by both Parties prior to the expiration of the Term.



EXHIBIT DETAILS

7.1 The Licensee shall operate the Exhibit(s) on the Operation Days, during the hours of the Event.

7.2 The Licensee may enter the Edmonton Expo Center Grounds to set up the Exhibit prior to the Operation Days at the discretion of the Canadian Country Expo organizers and must have completed its move-in within the allotted time period as confirmed by the Canadian Country Expo organizers.

7.3 The Licensee shall remove the Exhibit and vacate the Edmonton Expo Center Grounds at the conclusion of the Event and in no event later than 12:00 a.m. on October 12, 2026. The Licensee shall not vacate the Edmonton Expo Center Grounds until the conclusion of the Event unless otherwise directed by the Canadian Country Expo organizers.

7.4 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall indicate to the Licensee its specific move-in and move-out times and confirm the location of the Exhibit prior to move-in. The Licensee shall not operate the Exhibit outside the Exhibit space allocated to the Licensee. The Canadian Country Expo organizers may relocate the Exhibit to a location other than the confirmed Exhibit location, at the Canadian Country Expo organizers' sole discretion.

7.5 The Licensee shall not sell, offer, or display any product other than the products indicated on the Application at the price(s) indicated on the Application without the express written consent of the Canadian Country Expo organizers.

7.6 The Licensee shall process every sale of the Product through a cash register approved by the Canadian Country Expo organizers and that meets the Canadian Country Expo organizers' requirements, if any.

9. THIRD PARTY CONTRACTS

9.1 The Licensee shall comply with any contractual obligations between Canadian Country Expo, Explore Edmonton and any third party that may be imposed on Explore Edmonton' Grounds;

10. PRODUCT SUPPLY

10.1 The Canadian Country Expo organizers and Explore Edmonton are not responsible for loss of, or damage however caused to or by, the Licensee's products, including, but not limited to, loss or damage as a result of the delivery of the Licensee's products.

10.2 If Commission applies to the Exhibit the Licensee is operating, the Licensee shall provide the Canadian Country Expo organizers with:

(a) A copy of all receipts related to the products sold by the Licensee the previous Operation Day; and

(b) An inventory of the Licensee's products available for sale on the previous Operation Day and an inventory of the Licensee's products not sold at the end of the previous Operation Day; prior to 3:00 p.m. on the second Operation Day, and each Operation Day thereafter, and prior to 2:00 a.m. on the morning after the last Operation Day.



This adaptation ensures that the responsibilities and procedural requirements for handling and reporting product sales and inventory during the Canadian Country Expo are clearly outlined, emphasizing the accountability of Licensees for their products while acknowledging the organizational role of the Canadian Country Expo's management team.

11. CANADIAN COUNTRY EXPO'S GENERAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

11.1 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall have the sole right, in their unfettered discretion, to retain sponsors for the Event and to display sponsors' signage on the Edmonton Expo Center Grounds, including any Exhibit areas.

11.2 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall provide or make available, as the case may be, the necessary equipment for the Event (hereafter referred to as "Event Equipment").

11.3 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall not be responsible for any loss or damage of any nature resulting from the interruption or failure of the power or water/sewer services.

11.4 At the Licensee's request, the Canadian Country Expo organizers may, but shall in no way be obligated to, provide to the Licensee additional services, equipment, tools, or materials at the Licensee's sole cost and liability.

11.5 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall have the right, at all reasonable times, to examine and audit the Licensee's materials and records, at the organizers' cost and expense, either directly or through auditors appointed by the organizers, and, as a result of such examination and audit, to terminate this Agreement pursuant to the Termination for Material Default Section of this Agreement if deemed appropriate by the organizers, at their discretion. The Licensee's materials and records referenced in this Section shall include, but not be limited to, the products and Z-tapes.

11.6 The Canadian Country Expo organizers shall have the right, at all reasonable times, to examine and audit the Licensee's Exhibit activities, including, but not limited to, the quality of the products, and the Licensee's compliance with its obligations under this Agreement, at the organizers' cost and expense, either directly or through auditors appointed by the organizers, and, as a result of such examination and audit, to terminate this Agreement pursuant to the Termination for Material Default Section of this Agreement, if deemed appropriate by the organizers, at their discretion.

12. SAFETY & SECURITY

12.1 Joint Responsibility: The Canadian Country Expo (CCE) and Explore Edmonton are collectively not responsible for the loss of, or damage to, the Licensee's personal property, the Licensee's Equipment, or any equipment once in the Licensee's possession. The presence of security or watch personnel at the event does not signify an acceptance of responsibility by CCE or Explore Edmonton for the security and safety of such property or equipment.

12.2 Safety Approvals: The Licensee must ensure all goods or equipment requiring safety approval have Canadian Standards Association (CSA) certification or an equivalent certification, ensuring compliance with national safety standards.



12.3 Occupational Health & Safety Compliance: The Licensee acknowledges their role as an employer under the Occupational Health & Safety Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. O-2, and agrees to comply with this act, safeguarding the well-being of all involved in their exhibit.

12.4 Medical Services: All medical service costs, including medical or travel insurance for the Licensee, are solely the Licensee's responsibility. CCE and Explore Edmonton may, for convenience and at their discretion, provide access to on-site medical services, with the Licensee responsible for any incurred charges.

12.5 Safe Work Area: The Licensee is obligated to maintain a safe work area on the grounds managed by CCE and Explore Edmonton, ensuring safety for all their personnel and subcontractors. Claims of unsafe work conditions against CCE or Explore Edmonton will not absolve the Licensee of their indemnity obligations.

12.6 Approvals for Installations and Work: The Licensee must obtain prior approval for any installations or work from CCE and Explore Edmonton, coordinated through the assigned Event or Show Manager or another designated contact from either entity, ensuring that all additions and changes are in line with event guidelines and standards.

13. PUBLICITY AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

13.1 Intellectual Property Rights Grant: The Licensee grants the limited, revocable, non-exclusive, non-transferable, royalty-free right to both the Canadian Country Expo (CCE) and Explore Edmonton to use the Licensee's name, image, logos, trademarks, and any recordings of the Licensee, in perpetuity, solely for the purposes of promoting the Event, Explore Edmonton, the CCE, or both.

13.2 Publicity Approval: Should the Licensee arrange for any publicity of the Exhibit at the Event, such plans must be communicated to and receive prior consent from both CCE and Explore Edmonton. This ensures that all promotional efforts are in line with the overall messaging and branding of the Event and the venues.

13.3 Advertising and Promotion Guidelines: In advertising and promoting the Licensee's activities at the Event, the Licensee is to refer to the venues as follows, ensuring both CCE and Explore Edmonton are appropriately represented:

(a) Use "Edmonton EXPO Centre @ Canadian Country Expo and Explore Edmonton" for all web-based and social media communications. For all other forms of communication, use "Edmonton EXPO Centre, a Canadian Country Expo and Explore Edmonton Venue".

(b) For specific areas such as stages or event spaces that are managed under the collaboration, similar joint references should be made, adapting the names as necessary to reflect both CCE and Explore Edmonton's involvement.

13.4 Participation in Promotional Activities: The Licensee shall make all reasonable efforts to attend or participate in interviews, promotions, or any other marketing activities as requested by both the Canadian Country Expo and Explore Edmonton. This collaborative approach to publicity ensures that all stakeholders are represented and can leverage promotional opportunities to the fullest extent.

14. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE BY CANADIAN COUNTRY EXPO



14.1 Termination Authority: The Canadian Country Expo (CCE) may terminate this Agreement at any time for convenience without advance notice by providing written notice thereof to the Licensee. In the event of termination for convenience by CCE:

(a) Prior to the Event: If the effective date of termination specified in the notice falls prior to the Event, CCE shall be entitled to the Costs and shall refund to the Licensee the Deposit or Rent, whichever has been paid.

(b) During or After the Event: If the effective date of termination specified in the notice falls during the Event or after, CCE shall be entitled to the Costs and shall be entitled to the greater of:

i. The Rent paid to CCE by the Licensee; or

ii. Payment by the Licensee of any Commission accrued up to and including the effective date of termination;

and the Licensee shall have no further claims against CCE.

15. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE BY LICENSEE

15.1 Licensee's Right to Terminate:

The Licensee is granted the ability to terminate this Agreement for any reason by delivering a written notice of at least 60 days to the Canadian Country Expo (CCE). Upon such termination by the Licensee:

(a) Termination Notice More Than 60 Days Before the Event: If the termination notice's effective date is set more than 60 days before the Event, CCE will retain the Costs and the Deposit. Any additional Rent paid by the Licensee beyond these amounts will be refunded.

(b) Termination Notice 60 Days or Less Before the Event: If the termination notice's effective date is within 60 days before the Event, CCE is entitled to keep both the Costs and the full Rent paid.

After termination under these conditions, the Licensee will have no additional claims against the Canadian Country Expo. It is explicitly stated that the Licensee cannot terminate the Agreement during the Event itself.

16. TERMINATION FOR MATERIAL DEFAULT

16.1 Definitions:

(a) Change in Control: Refers to any shift in legal or beneficial ownership of more than 50% of the voting securities of the Defaulting Party, potentially changing the majority of the board of directors.

(b) Asset Transaction: The sale of substantially all assets of the Defaulting Party.

16.2 Termination Rights: Either Party may terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice if:

(a) The Defaulting Party (Licensee) fails to:



- i. Maintain professional conduct;
- ii. Provide the Canadian Country Expo (CCE) with a valid Certificate of Insurance as required by this Agreement;
- iii. Fulfill payment obligations such as Deposit, Rent, or Commission;
- iv. Submit necessary documentation like Z-tapes or the Percentage Payment Report & Receipt Form to CCE.

(b) There's a material breach of this Agreement's terms by the Defaulting Party.

(c) Any representations or warranties made by the Defaulting Party are proven materially incorrect or false.

(d) A Change in Control or Asset Transaction occurs without the Non-Defaulting Party's prior written consent, which can be withheld at their discretion.

(e) The Defaulting Party ceases or threatens to cease business operations.

(f) The Defaulting Party makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors or proposes to creditors under bankruptcy or insolvency laws.

(g) Bankruptcy proceedings are initiated against the Defaulting Party, or a receiver is appointed over their assets.

(h) Legal processes become enforceable against the Defaulting Party or their property is subjected to distress or similar processes.

16.3 Consequences of Termination by CCE:

(a) CCE retains all payments made by the Licensee, including Costs, Deposit, Rent, and Commission, as a reasonable estimate of anticipated payments under this Agreement.

(b) The Licensee must settle all outstanding payments due to CCE, including accrued Commission up to the termination date.

16.4 Consequences of Termination by the Licensee:

Should the Licensee terminate this Agreement, CCE will refund any Deposit, Rent, and Commission paid by the Licensee, and no further claims against CCE will be entertained.

17 TERMINATION FOR FORCE MAJEURE

17.1 Definition of Force Majeure Occurrence:

A "Force Majeure Occurrence" includes, but is not limited to, acts of God, strikes, labor disputes, war, fire, earthquakes, acts of public enemies, riots, acts of terrorism, epidemics, actions by governmental authorities at any level, or any event beyond the reasonable control of a Party. Additionally, unsafe conditions due to inclement weather, as reasonably determined by the Canadian Country Expo (CCE), may lead to a halt or modification of the Event. It is explicitly stated that a Party's lack of funds does not constitute a Force Majeure Occurrence.

17.2 Non-breach due to Force Majeure:



If a Party fails to meet its contractual obligations due to a Force Majeure Occurrence, this shall not be considered a breach of the Agreement. However, the affected Party is expected to make reasonable commercial efforts to resume fulfillment of its obligations as soon as possible.

17.3 CCE's Discretion to Terminate:

CCE reserves the exclusive right to terminate this Agreement immediately in the event of a Force Majeure Occurrence.

18.1 Insurance Requirements: The Licensee must obtain and maintain at its own expense, various forms of insurance, all to the satisfaction of Explore Majeure Occurrence. Upon such termination by CCE:

(a) Before Move-In: CCE will refund the Licensee any Costs, Deposits, or Rent paid, after which the Licensee will have no further claims against CCE.

(b) At Move-In or Afterward: CCE is entitled to retain the Costs and will receive the greater of either:

i. The Rent already paid by the Licensee to CCE; or

ii. Any Commission due up to and including the termination's effective date.

18 INSURANCE

(a) Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance: Must have a minimum coverage of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence, potentially more if specified in the Application. This policy covers liabilities for bodily injury, personal injury, death, and property damage, including products and completed operations liability. This insurance must name "Edmonton Explore Edmonton," and the "City of Edmonton" as additional insureds.

(b) Standard Automobile Insurance: This policy should provide third-party liability coverage for bodily injury and property damage with a minimum limit of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per claim. It covers the injury to or death of one or more persons and damage to or destruction of property.

(c) Other Insurance: As reasonably required by Explore Edmonton, in the form, amount, and against the risks a prudent party under similar circumstances would insure.

18.2 Certificate of Insurance: The Licensee must deliver to Explore Edmonton a completed and executed Certificate of Insurance, as per Schedule "D" or an equivalent form approved by Explore Edmonton, by September 15th, 2026, confirming the coverage for the Term.

18.3 Medical/Travel Insurance: The Licensee is responsible for arranging, at its own cost, any necessary medical or travel insurance. A failure to acquire adequate medical or travel insurance does not affect Explore Edmonton's liabilities or exposure to costs, expenses, or damages.

18.4 Additional Requirements: The Licensee shall provide, at its own expense, all necessary personnel in line with the terms of this Agreement. If required by law, the Licensee must also carry and pay for Workers' Compensation Insurance.

19. INDEMNITY



19.1 Definition for Indemnity Purposes: For this Indemnity Section only, “CCE” includes the Canadian Country Expo, its subsidiaries, respective Boards and Board members, directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, volunteers, insurers, heirs, and assigns.

19.2 Licensee's Obligations: The Licensee shall indemnify and save harmless CCE, and its contractors and sub-contractors, from any and all actions, proceedings, claims, judicial review, demands, losses, debts, fines, penalties, costs, and expenses (including but not limited to legal fees and expenses on a solicitor-and-his-own-client basis) (collectively the “Losses”), that may be brought against or suffered by CCE (including its contractors and sub-contractors) or that CCE (including its contractors and sub-contractors) may sustain, pay, or incur that are directly or indirectly attributable to the performance or non-performance by the Licensee of its obligations under this Agreement, or the negligent or wilful acts or omissions of the Licensee except to the extent that such Losses are the result of negligence by CCE, its contractors and sub-contractors, or any material breach of contract by CCE. This Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

19.3 Additional Indemnity to the City: The Licensee shall also indemnify and save harmless the City of Edmonton (the “City”), which includes its Council and Council members, officers, employees, contractors, subcontractors, agents, representatives, volunteers, and insurers, from any and all Losses that may be brought against or suffered by the City or that the City may sustain, pay, or incur that are directly or indirectly attributable to the performance or non-performance by the Licensee of its obligations under this Agreement, or the negligent or wilful acts or omissions of the Licensee except to the extent that such Losses are the result of negligence by the City, or any material breach of contract by the City. This Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

19.4 Risk Acceptance by the Licensee: The Licensee accepts all risks associated with this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the use of the Exhibit and environs. The Licensee waives any and all Losses against CCE, howsoever caused, to the Licensee, its subsidiaries, respective directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, volunteers, contractors, sub-contractors, insurers, heirs, and assigns.

This adaptation ensures that the indemnity provisions are specifically tailored to the Canadian Country Expo, outlining the Licensee's responsibilities to indemnify CCE (and, where applicable, the City of Edmonton) against losses arising from their actions or inactions, while also recognizing the ongoing obligations beyond the termination or expiration of the Agreement.

Adapting the "General" section for the Canadian Country Expo (CCE) involves revising references from "Explore Edmonton" to "CCE" and ensuring that the terms and conditions specifically reflect the obligations, rights, and procedural aspects pertinent to CCE. Here's the adapted section:

20. GENERAL

20.1 Notices:

(a) All notices, communication, requests, and statements (the “Notice”) required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing. Notice shall be served by one of the following means:



- i. Personally, by delivering it to the party on whom it is to be served at the address specified in the Agreement, during normal business hours. Personally delivered Notice shall be deemed received when actually delivered.
- ii. By fax directed to the party on whom it is to be served at that fax number specified in the Agreement. Faxed notice shall be deemed received according to the sender's fax confirmation receipt.
- iii. By pre-paid first-class registered post. Notice so served shall be deemed received seventy-two (72) hours after being post-marked. In case of a postal strike, no Notice sent by postal service during or within seven (7) days before or after the strike shall be deemed received unless actually received.
- iv. By pre-paid courier service. Couriered Notice shall be deemed received when actually delivered.

(b) The Parties' respective addresses for Notice are as follows:

(c) The Licensee consents to the sending of electronic communications by CCE, in compliance with applicable Canadian legislation, and such consent shall continue during and after the expiry of the term.

20.2 Counterparts: This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each deemed an original, constituting together one and the same instrument. A counterpart may be delivered by fax.

20.3 Singular, Plural and Gender: The singular includes the plural and vice versa, and gender references include all genders, where the context requires.

20.4 Governing Law: Governed by the laws of Alberta, with jurisdiction attorned to the Courts of Alberta, specifically Edmonton.

20.5 Time of Essence: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.

20.6 Survival: Provisions meant to survive the expiry or termination of this Agreement shall do so.



20.7 Overlooking and Condoning: No condoning, excusing, or overlooking by CCE of any breach shall operate as a waiver of rights or affect subsequent breaches.

20.8 Confidential Information: The Agreement's terms are confidential, not to be disclosed except as authorized by the Parties.

20.9 Captions: Headings are for convenience only and do not affect interpretation.

20.10 Relationship Between Parties: Nothing herein creates a relationship of principal and agent, employment, partnership, or joint venture.

20.11 Entire Relationship: This Agreement constitutes the entire relationship between the Parties, superseding any prior understandings.

20.12 Amendments: Any alterations must be in writing and signed by the Parties.

20.13 Statutory Reference: References to statutes include all regulations and judicial decisions related to the statute, as amended.

20.14 Assignment: No assignment of rights or obligations without prior written consent.

20.15 Severance: If any provision is invalid, others remain in effect.

20.16 Binding Effect: Binding on successors and permitted assigns.

20.17 Further Assurance: Parties agree to execute further documents as necessary to carry out this Agreement.

20.18 Set-Off: CCE may set off any amounts due to it against any amounts owed to the Licensee.

20.19 Third Party Contracts: The Licensee shall not enter contracts on behalf of CCE.

20.20 Cumulative Remedies: Remedies are cumulative and not exclusive of any others.

20.21 Authority to Contract: Each Party warrants its authority to enter this Agreement.

21 INDEPENDENT LEGAL ADVICE

21.1 The Parties hereby acknowledge and confirm that each was advised by the other to obtain independent legal or other professional advice and that by executing this Agreement each hereby confirms that it has had the opportunity to seek independent legal or professional advice prior to executing this Agreement and has either:

- (a) Obtained such independent legal or other professional advice; or
- (b) Waived the right to obtain such independent legal or other professional advice.
