# Montana State outlasts Ill. State for national title

For the first time in more than four decades, the Montana State football team has captured a national championship.

The Bobcats (14-2) held off a furious Illinois State rally at Vanderbilt University's First Bank Stadium in Nashville on Monday Jan. 5, as Taco Dowler scored on their first possession in overtime and kicker Myles Sansted booted through the decisive extra point for the 35-34 Football Championship Subdivision final victory.

The Redbirds scored on a Dylan Lord catch from quarterback Tommy Rittenhouse to open overtime, but MSU managed to block the ensuing PAT.

Facing fourth-and-10 on the next possession from the 14-yard line, Bobcats quarterback Justin Lamson found Dowler wide open for the equalizer, and the following kick clinched the trophy.

It was the first national title for the Bobcats since 1984 and the program's fourth overall, following the NAIA championship in 1956 and the NCAA Division II crown in 1976.

"Bobcats from all the generations are a part of this," MSU head coach Brent Vigen told ESPN. "The teams that have preceded and built us to this point. This group wanted to finish (it) off for all of them. It's amazing. This crowd is amazing. All of us Bobcats are champions."

The title triumph marked the third appearance in the championship game for MSU under Vigen, who led the program to runner-up finishes in 2021 and last season – both to North Dakota State.

The game was broadcast on ESPN with Montana native and former NFL quarterback Brock Osweiler on the call, along with play-by-play announcer Dave Flemming.

Lamson threw for 280 yards on 18 of 27 passing with two touchdowns while also rushing for a pair of scores.

Dowler hauled in eight catches for 111 yards and the would-be game-winner in overtime for MSU while also rushing for a 22-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

Cole Taylor led the Bobcats in tackles at linebacker with four solo stops and 12 assists.

Trailing 21-7 at the half, Illinois State held the Bobcats to just one score in the second half, and Rittenhouse threw two fourth-quarter touchdowns to tie it up as the Redbirds dominated the time of

possession 39:41 to 20:19 in regulation.

Illinois State attempted a go-ahead field goal with just over a minute to go in the fourth from 38 yards out, but the kick was blocked.

MSU nearly reached field goal range in the waning moments, but a bad snap set the Bobcats back and forced them to punt, ultimately setting up overtime.

MSU scored on its opening drive of the game as it marched 90 yards in 10 plays with Lamson running it in from 3 yards out. The drive was sparked by a 17-yard run by tailback Adam Jones and a 26-yard connection between Lamson and Taco Dowler on second-and-23.

The Bobcats took a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter as the offense went 80 yards in eight plays, with Lamson powering across the goal line for a two-yard score.

After the Redbirds got on the scoreboard late in the first half, MSU struck fast with less than a minute left in the second. Lamson completed three passes for 75 yards, including a 33-yard score to Dane Steel – who broke a tackle and hurdled a defender before diving into the end zone for the TD.

The Bobcats started the season 0-2 with losses to Football Bowl Subdivision power Oregon and South Dakota State but ripped off 13 straight wins to reach the championship game.

MSU earned the Big Sky Conference title with a 31-28 victory over the University of Montana in November before a 48-23 victory over the Grizzlies in a semifinal rematch of the Brawl of the Wild on Dec. 20.

Illinois State (12-5) became the first team in FCS history to win four straight road playoff games, according to the ESPN broadcast.

# Dallas defensive coordinator Eberflus fired after one year

Matt Eberflus' debut season with the Dallas Cowboys won't have a follow-up. The team on Tuesday Jan. 6 fired the embattled defensive coordinator, marking yet another shift for a unit that found itself under fire in 2025.

"Having known Matt Eberflus for decades now, we have tremendous respect and appreciation for him as a coach and a person," Cowboys owner Jerry Jones said in a statement. "After reviewing and discussing the results of our defensive performance this season, though, it was clear that change is needed. This is the first step in that process, and we will continue that review as it applies to reaching our much higher expectations."

Eberflus, who was the Chicago Bears' head coach from 2022 to 2024, was hired in January 2025 to bring a steady head to first-year head coach Brian Schottenheimer's staff. But Dallas ended the season last in scoring defense, with its 511 points surrendered representing a franchise worst.

Despite quarterback Dak Prescott leading an attack that ranked second in yards per game, the Cowboys finished 7-9-1 and missed the playoffs.

Jones had grown increasingly vocal in his public criticisms of the defense in recent weeks. He made it clear, however, that he didn't believe Eberflus was the sole party at fault for the unit's performance.

"Make no mistake about it: Everybody had their finger in what we did out

there defensively. Everybody," Jones said. "It's not just a one-man blame at all. I say that because therein lies what you have to sit down and figure out, what, if anything, you want to change."

"We'll get to that pronto. Everybody involved in this thing, I'm sure, has been thinking ahead about how to adjust out of our results this year."

The outlook of the defense had a major shift in August when star pass rusher Micah Parsons was traded to the Green Bay Packers. Jones justified the move, which came as tensions regarding Parsons' contract negotiation boiled over, by pointing to the improvements Dallas could make in its run defense. But the unit would struggle throughout the season against the pass, suffering repeated coverage breakdowns while struggling to generate a consistent edge rush.

# U.S. sends speed skating team to Milano with lots of potential for medals

MILWAUKEE – The U.S. Speedskating team is complete.

Sarah Warren, who narrowly missed the Olympic team four years ago, secured her spot at the Milano Cortina Games by winning the 500-meter race on Monday night Jan. 5. She was one of four skaters added to the U.S. team in the final day of the Olympic trials.

Zach Stoppelmoor qualified in the 500 meters; Ethan Cepuran got a spot in the mass start; and Giorgia Birkdale was nominated as a team pursuit specialist. They join:

- Jordan Stolz (500, 1,000, 1,500 meters and mass start).
- Cooper McLeod (500 and 1,000 meters).
- Casey Dawson (1,500, 5,000, 10,000 meters and team pursuit).
- Emery Lehman (1,500 meters and team pursuit).
- Conor McDermott-Mostowy (1,000 meters).
- Erin Jackson (500 and 1,000 meters).
- Brittany Bowe (1,000 and 1,500 meters).
- Mia Manganello (mass start and team pursuit).
- Greta Myers (1,500 meters and team pursuit).

Stolz will be a gold medal favorite in all of his events, while the men's team pursuit also will be favorites for gold. Jackson and Bowe will be contenders at both of their distances, while Mia Manganello has a chance to medal in the mass start. The women's team pursuit also has medal potential.

"I think it's really good," Stolz said when asked to assess the team. "I think

we have some good (medal) opportunities."

Warren earning her spot was one of the more emotional moments of the night.

After playing soccer at the University of Illinois, Warren returned to speed skating in 2021. She nearly made the U.S. team for the 2022 Olympics in Beijing, finishing fourth in the 500 meters and fifth in both the 1,000 and 1,500 meters.

She's had nine knee surgeries over the course of her career, and another on her ankle.

Jackson, the reigning Olympic champion in the 500 meters, had prequalified her spot through her success in the World Cups this season. The person with the next-fastest time after a 500-meter race Sunday and another Monday would join her.

Warren was second to Jackson on Sunday. With Jackson not racing Monday, Warren posted the fastest time to clinch her Olympic spot. When she crossed the finish line, Warren screamed and began crying.

# Bans' purpose to erase trans athletes

The Supreme Court can issue rulings in a million cases, and it won't make transgender people disappear.

That's what this is about. Not who gets to participate in sports or protecting women or preserving Title IX.

Erasure. Permanently removing transgender women from every social space so bigots and people who don't care to be educated no longer have to look at or think about a group of people they don't understand or who make them uncomfortable, while making all women adhere to a prescribed idea of femininity.

That's abundantly clear in the rabid pushback in the two cases before the Supreme Court on Jan. 13 that challenge bans of transgender athletes in Idaho and West Virginia.

The original plaintiffs in both these cases, one a transgender teen who has never gone through male puberty and the other a transgender woman on hormone therapy, have documentation showing they do not have a physiological advantage over other female athletes. Contrary to what the braying mob would have you believe, neither state has been overrun with transgender athletes.

In fact, the West Virginia ban applies to one athlete, who was 11 when the ban took effect in 2021.

Yet the Trump administration, the right-wing legal machine and celebrity transphobes have all weighed in, hoping to use the cases as a means of pushing transgender women and girls even further out of public view. While each case centers on an individual ath-

lete's appeal of one state's ban, their defeat could be used to uphold participation bans in 25 other states and call other protections for transgender people into question.

"Our hope is certainly that we prevail," said Joshua Block, who as senior counsel for the ACLU's LGBTQ and HIV Projects will argue in the West Virginia case.

"But we also hope that, regardless of what happens, this case isn't successfully used as a tool to undermine the rights of transgender folks more generally. In areas far beyond athletics," Block added.

But that is the goal. It's always been the goal.

## Transgender people have always existed

Transgender people have existed since time began and will continue to do so regardless of what the Supreme Court decides. So, too, non-binary people. And women with differences of sex development. Women with Swyer Syndrome. Women with hormonal imbalances. And so on and so on. Gender does not and never has fit neatly into two boxes, as any biologist or geneticist worth their salt will tell you.

For much of the 21st century, the International Olympic Committee and NCAA recognized that. They had protocols allowing athletes to participate as their identified gender, and no one raised a fuss. Cisgender women — those born with XX chromosomes — weren't crowded off the podium or the playing field. Locker rooms remained safe spaces — except from predatory coaches, the overwhelming majority of whom are cisgender men.

The transgender girls and women who participated in sports were doing so for the very same reasons as other

girls and women: To have fun, to play with their friends and to benefit from the life lessons sports provide.

"All I've ever wanted was the same opportunities as my peers," said Becky Pepper-Jackson, a shot putter and the plaintiff in the West Virginia case.

Yet after Americans realized that attempts to paint gays and lesbians as predators and threats to the moral order were nonsense (and hypocritical), the right wing shifted its twisted obsession to the transgender community.

## Transgender people are a minuscule part of population

According to the Williams Institute at the UCLA School of Law, just 1% of the U.S. population is transgender. That means most Americans don't know someone who is transgender and, thus, don't have personal knowledge to counter the narrative that transgender women are a threat to other girls and women, be it in bathrooms or athletics. The anti-trans mob has doubled down on this by playing fast and loose with science, extrapolating the athletic results of cisgender men for those of transgender women when that is akin to comparing apples and oranges.

Worst of all, they've been able to make the transgender community into a bogeyman for people unsettled by a changing world and looking for someone to blame.

They are not, of course.

No one is forcing kids to transition. Transgender people aren't lurking in bathrooms, waiting to assault people. Transgender women athletes aren't stealing trophies and opportunities from other women en masse.

All they want to do is exist.

"This is unfair to me and every transgender kid who just wants the

freedom to be themselves," Pepper-Johnson said. "I've had my rights and my life debated by politicians who've never even met me."

## Other women harmed by transgender athlete bans

You know who else it's unfair to? Any girl or woman who doesn't look or act like the stereotype pushed by the right wing and transphobes. In states with bans, there are already cases of girls with short hair or who are tomboys having their gender questioned or being asked to "prove" they were born female.

This "defense" of women's sports also undermines them, making the implicit argument that women's sports are less worthy because those who play them are inferior to male athletes. (This is also why no one ever makes a peep about transgender male athletes.)

And don't get me started on those who are fixated on the small number of transgender athletes but have nothing to say about actual Title IX violations and the disproportionate investment in women's sports.

Even if the Supreme Court upholds the bans, even if it provides cover for bigotry, transgender people will continue to exist. It might take years or even decades, but their humanity will eventually be recognized and these bans will join other legalized discrimination in the dark corner of history where they belong.

The Supreme Court can set that in motion by striking down these bans. Or the court, like those who would see transgender people marginalized out of existence, can keep denying reality.

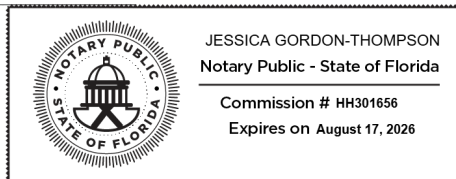

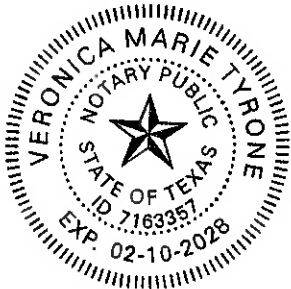

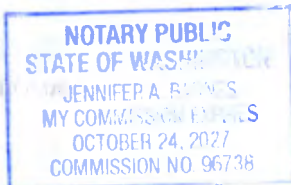
