WNBA GAME 1 PLAYOFF WINNERS AND LOSERS

# Kelsey Mitchell cooks, Aces struggle

The Indiana Fever continued their somewhat surprising WNBA postseason run by stunning the Las Vegas Aces 89-73 in Game 1 of their semifinal series.

Kelsey Mitchell led the Fever with a career playoff high of 34 points. Mitchell, who finished the regular season ranked third in scoring with 20.2 points per game, shot 12 of 23 (52.2%), including 4 of 6 from 3-point range.

"I think what you guys see is just me trying to just be a kid in the playground," Mitchell said.

In the second game Sunday Sept. 21, the top-seeded Minnesota Lynx took care of business. They defeated the Phoenix Mercury 82-69 in Minneapolis at the Target Center. Courtney Williams had 23 points, eight rebounds and seven assists to lead the Lynx.

"We never feel like we are down. We are a resilient group," Williams said when asked about Minnesota being down 47-40 at halftime. "We never look up at the scoreboard. We just try and go get kills, which is stops."

## WINNERS

### Fever guard Kelsey Mitchell

Mitchell may have finished fifth in the voting, but she looked like the MVP on the court. Mitchell scored a career playoff-best 34 points in the Fever's victory over four-time MVP A'ja Wilson and the Las Vegas Aces. Mitchell shot an efficient 12 of 23 from the field including 4 of 6 from the 3-point line. Mitchell is the first Fever player to score 30 or more points in a playoff game since Shavonte Zellous in the 2012 WNBA Finals. Aces coach Becky Hammon summed it up perfectly: "Clearly we had no answer for (Kelsey) Mitchell. Couldn't even attempt to slow her down a little bit."

### Fever guard Odyssey Sims

Sims started the 2025 season with the Los Angeles Sparks. After being waived on July 2, the point guard signed an emergency hardship contract with the Fever on Aug. 10. Sims seamlessly stepped in for Indiana's injured guards and has been a key part of the Fever's postseason run. She stepped on the gas (literally) in the Fever's Game 1 blowout win and finished with 17 points (13 in the second half), three assists, three steals and only one turnover.

### Lynx guard Courtney Williams

Williams was due for a breakout game and turned it in. After averaging 8.8 points in the Lynx's first-round series against the Golden State Valkyries, Williams exploded for a game-high 23 points, eight rebounds, seven assists and five steals in Game 1 vs. Phoenix. Williams effortlessly controlled the game, creating her own shots, while simultaneously making the right passes. She becomes the fifth player in WNBA

playoff history with 20 points, five rebounds, five assists and five steals in a game, joining Breanna Stewart, Tamika Catchings, Sheryl Swoopes and Alyssa Thomas. "We needed aggression against these guys and Courtney (Williams) did it for us, even though she's one of the smallest on the court," Lynx coach Cheryl Reeves said.

### Courtney Williams' dad

Donald Williams, the father of Lynx guard Courtney Williams, had plenty to cheer about in the Lynx's Game 1 win. (See above.) He was seen cheering and dancing courtside at Target Center.

### Lynx forward Maria Kliundikova

Maria Kliundikova added instant impact off the bench in the second half for the Lynx. Reeve opted to put in Kliundikova for Alanna Smith in the closing seconds of the third quarter and her presence was instantly felt. She got a clutch offensive rebound with 8:36 remaining in the game that led to a made 3-pointer from Kayla McBride to put the Lynx up 64-59. Kliundikova finished with four points, four rebounds, two steals, one assist and was plus-14 in eight minutes of work. "It was huge ... we were all turned for her because we know what she can do," Courtney Williams said. "She was a game changer for us. When you sit most of the game and have to come in and make that instant impact, you just have to be mentally strong, and that's what she is."

### Minnesota's Big 3

Minnesota's Big 3 of Napheesa Collier, Kayla McBride and Courtney Williams won the first battle against Phoenix's Big 3. McBride finished with 21 points (6 of 17, 4 of 9 3PT), six rebounds and two assists, while Collier scored 18 points (8 of 16 FG, 2 of 6 3PT), nine rebounds and two assists. Can't forget about Williams, who Reeve called the "player of the game for us."

## LOSERS

### Phoenix's Big 3

The Mercury's Big 3 started red hot in Game 1, with forward Alyssa Thomas (16 points), guard Kahleah Copper (11) and forward Satou Sabally (8) combining for 35 of Phoenix's 47 points in the first half. But the Mercury's trio appeared to hit a wall during the second half. Copper scored 11 points in the second half to bring her to 22 points total, but Thomas and Sabally scored two points each in the second half, finishing with 18 and 10 points respectively. Fatigue could be a factor as the Mercury are coming off a Game 3 win over the New York Liberty in the first round less than 48 hours before the semis tipped off. Entering the semifinals the Mercury were 15-0 this season when their Big 3 score 10-plus points each.

### Aces center A'ja Wilson

Aces center A'ja Wilson was awarded

her record-setting fourth MVP trophy ahead of Game 1 vs. the Fever, but her special day was spoiled by a blowout loss to the Fever. Indiana forced Wilson into tough shots all game long and held her to 27.2% from the field (6 of 22) and 0 of 1 from the 3-point line. (In comparison, Wilson averaged 50.5% from the field this season.) She was held to one field goal the entire second half (1 of 6) and was limited with four fouls by the third quarter. To add insult to injury, the loss snapped the Aces' 12-game home winning streak. Wilson didn't look like herself and will need to bounce back to get even with the Fever in Game 2 on Tuesday, Sept. 23 (9:30 p.m. ET, ESPN).

### Aces guard Jewell Loyd

The Aces have the luxury of having a two-time WNBA champion, two-time Olympic gold medalist, WNBA scoring leader and six-time WNBA All-Star coming off the bench, but Jewell Loyd was nearly nonexistent in Game 1 vs. the Fever. Loyd was held scoreless until midway through the fourth quarter when she knocked down a 3-point shot for her sole field goal of the game. Loyd finished with three points in 28 minutes, going 1 of 5 from the field and 1 of 4 from the 3-point line. Her stat sheet was rounded out by three steals, one rebound and one assist. Becky Hammon lamented her team's depth afterward, adding, "God forbid A'ja (Wilson) doesn't drop 40 for us."

### Phoenix's 3-point shooting

The Mercury were held to 3 of 23 from the 3-point line in the Game 1 loss. Phoenix has a significant advantage when its 3-point shot is falling and was 12-1 this regular season when shooting 40% or better from the 3-point line. The Mercury, who recorded a league-leading four games with 15 or more 3-pointers, haven't hit the 40% mark from 3 in all four of their playoff games. Game 2 of the series is at 7:30 Tuesday on ESPN.

## Storm let go of coach Quinn

The Seattle Storm have announced head coach Noelle Quinn's contract will not be renewed for the 2026 season following the team's second consecutive first-round playoff exit.

Storm general manager Talisa Rhea was appreciative for Quinn's service in a news release. "On behalf of our organization, I would like to thank Noelle for her time with the Storm. Her commitment to the ongoing success of our organization and to furthering the development of our players was second to none." Rhea said. "She put us in a position to win at the highest levels of the game and for that, we are grateful." Quinn's tenure ended with a 74-73

loss to the Las Vegas Aces on Sept. 18. The Storm finished the regular season as the WNBA's No. 7 seed with a 23-21 record, a noticeable step back from the team's 25-15 regular-season record a year ago. After retiring as a player, Quinn immediately joined the Storm coaching staff as an assistant coach, taking over the head coaching position from Dan Hughes in mid-2021. Quinn reached the playoffs in four of her five years as head coach. Quinn's Storm advanced past the first round of the playoffs once during her five-year tenure (2021). Her teams were 97-89 record in the regular season and 4-8 in the postseason.

# Blaney wins playoff race, lobster at New Hampshire

Ryan Blaney booked his ticket into the Round of 8 of the NASCAR Cup Series playoffs after taking the checkered flag at New Hampshire Motor Speedway on Sunday, Sept. 21. The victory was his third of the season and 16th of his Cup Series career.

Blaney's No. 12 Ford was the fastest car in practice a day earlier, and it was again one of the fastest on race day, es-

pecially in the third and final stage. Blaney took the lead with 74 laps remaining in the race and regained it on a restart with less than 50 to go before holding off Josh Berry to take the checkered flag in the Mobil 1 301, the first of three races in the second round of the playoffs.

Blaney said he was looking forward to receiving – and tasting – one of the most unique prizes in NASCAR. The winner of the race is given a live lobster – a staple in New England. "I've wanted a lobster ever since I was a little kid

coming to watch these races. I've always wanted one of those things, so I'm looking forward to it," Blaney said.

Blaney, who started second, led 116 of the 301 laps, second only to Team Penske teammate Joey Logano, who started on the pole and led 147 laps. Logano finished behind Blaney, Berry and Hendrick Motorsports driver William Byron, the regular-season champ.

Byron led a rebound of HMS drivers after the normally dominant team looked average in the first round of the

playoffs. All three of Hendrick's remaining playoff drivers finished in the top 10, with Chase Elliott coming home fifth and Kyle Larson seventh.

Christopher Bell, who won last week at Bristol Motor Speedway, led the Joe Gibbs Racing contingent after the team swept all three races of the first round. Bell took sixth while Chase Briscoe and Denny Hamlin finished 10th and 12th.

Trackhouse Racing's Ross Chastain was the other playoff driver to earn a top-10 finish, coming home ninth.

# Europe repeats at Ryder Cup on U.S. soil

## McIlroy makes good on 2023 promise of road win

FARMINGDALE, NY — There were only 37 living competitors of European Ryder Cup teams past and present who had ever won on U.S. soil, including current players Justin Rose and Rory McIlroy, who had been part of the victorious side in 2012, the last time Europe tasted victory on this side of the pond. Well, make it 47 after Europe withstood a furious rally by the Americans in the 45th Ryder Cup at Bethpage Black to win 15-13.

Led by European Luke Donald, the first captain to win the Cup in consecutive matches since fellow Englishman Tony Jacklin in 1985 and 1987, Europe built an unprecedented seven-point lead heading into Sunday singles, becoming the second team since the 28-point format started in 1979 to win each of the first four sessions. In the end Sept. 28, Europe won for the 11th time in the last 15 Ryder Cups.

"It's been the most stressful 12 hours in my life," Donald said. "Shout-out to the Americans ... I knew it would be tough. I didn't think they would be this tough."

U.S. Ryder Cup captain Keegan Bradley crossed his arms and looked to be the loneliest man in a crowded arena on Saturday as he watched his big guns, world No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (0-4) and two-time U.S. Open champion Bryson DeChambeau (1-3), combine for a record of 1-7 during the first two days.

But Bradley is a die-hard New England Patriots fan and he told his team on Saturday night that he had been at Super Bowl 51 when the Patriots rallied from a 28-3 deficit against the Atlanta Falcons before winning in overtime, the largest comeback in Super Bowl history. His message to his team was let's go make history. While a partisan crowd came out in support to roar their team to a miraculous comeback, it was not to be. But not without an incredible fight.

DeChambeau was 5 down after seven holes as England's Matt Fitzpatrick

birdied four of the first six holes. But DeChambeau came raging back, winning the eighth, ninth, 14th and 15th, and when Fitzpatrick lipped out at 17 the match was tied and finished with a half point for each side.

"Man, I gave it everything I had today for the team," DeChambeau said. "Like my dad always said, you've just got to keep swimming. You can't give up. That's what I did today."

For the first time, world No. 1 faced world No. 2 in a Ryder Cup match. Scheffler, the top-ranked player, and McIlroy, his nearest competitor, were two welterweight champions shadow boxing for the first 10 holes as the two tired golfers, who had both played five matches, didn't have their best stuff. "It was a bit of a pillow fight, let's be honest," McIlroy said.

Scheffler pulled ahead with a bogey at the 10th but McIlroy answered right back with a birdie at 11. Scheffler regained the lead at 14, winning again with a par. At 15, McIlroy's birdie putt circled the cup and he turned to the crowd and pounded his chest. But Scheffler responded with a birdie to halve the hole and clenched his fist. He held on for a 1-up victory and avoided going winless for the week.

"The fight that these guys showed today, the fight that Bryson showed today

and yesterday, I mean, the way he played in our match in the afternoon was amazing, and I don't think I could have done what I did in my match today if he didn't do what he was doing in front of me," Scheffler said. "He's an emotional leader of our team and he's been great, and I'm proud to be battling with guys like that out here."

There would only be 11 matches instead of a full slate of 12 contested as an injured Viktor Hovland was scratched due to a neck injury and his match with American Harris English — based on the captain's agreement — was ruled a tie.

"He's devastated. He's gutted," Donald said of Hovland.

The U.S. tied a record with 8½ points in singles, winning six matches and halving five others. American Cameron Young went out first and canned a 15-foot birdie putt at 18 to edge England's Justin Rose and claim a hard-earned point. Young was one of the few bright spots for the Americans, winning 19 holes for the week, best on the team, and finishing with a record of 3-1.

"I've been thinking about having a putt like that for a while," Young said. "The way things were going halfway through the back nine today, I didn't want that putt, and then the way things were going through 17, I was very grateful that I had a chance there."

Justin Thomas prevented England's Tommy Fleetwood from becoming the first European to win all five matches on foreign soil, sinking a 12-foot birdie putt on 18 for a 1-up win. Moments later, American Xander Schauffele dispatched Jon Rahm 4 and 3 and the U.S. had closed the gap to 12-8 with only one match at the time being led by Europe. Not long after, J.J. Spaun, the reigning U.S. Open champion, rolled in a birdie at 15 to go 3 up and beat Sepp Straka 2 and 1. The momentum had swung to the U.S. and suddenly the most improbable of comebacks seemed possible.

Sweden's Ludvig Aberg got a much-needed point for the Euros, downing Patrick Cantlay 2 and 1, to put Europe on the doorstep of victory.

"It is nervy. You're playing for a lot more than just yourself, which is also why this is so fun. This is why this is the best tournament in the world and I'm

glad to have contributed to my team," he said.

That left it to Ireland's Shane Lowry to hole a birdie putt of 6 feet to win the 18th hole and tie his match with Russell Henley, who left his 10-foot putt short, and earn the 14th point that Europe needed to retain the Cup.

"I've never felt nerves quite like that," Henley said. "It was quite an experience, quite an atmosphere."

Lowry, who had a record of 1-0-2, seconded that notion. "I've been so lucky to experience amazing things in this game. That was the hardest couple of hours of my whole life, honestly. I just can't believe that putt went in."

Lowry said to his caddie, Darren Reynolds, walking down 18, "I have a chance to do the coolest thing in my life here." And he got the job done. "The Ryder Cup means everything to me," he said. "I've won the Open in Ireland; it's amazing, it's a dream come true. But the Ryder Cup for me is everything."

American Ben Griffin won 1 up over Rasmus Hojgaard after both sat all day on Saturday. That brought the score to 14-12. England's Tyrrell Hatton, who earned a record of 3-0-1, secured the winning half point by tying his match with Collin Morikawa. In the final match, American Sam Burns missed a putt on 18 to lose the final hole and tie Robert MacIntyre.

The European side won just one singles match, the lowest such total since 1957 when Great Britain managed just one singles win along with six losses and one tie. But they did enough to win on foreign soil for the fourth time in the last eight away matches and fifth time overall.

Two years ago, McIlroy said that winning an away Ryder Cup was one of the biggest accomplishments in golf. "And that's what we're going to do at Bethpage," he said.

He went 3-1-1 for the week, finishing on the winning side for the sixth time in his eight cups, and was the talismanic leader of one of the great team victories in all of sports.

"When you win a Ryder Cup, it isn't about you," McIlroy said. "It's about the team, and we did enough to get the job done."

# U.S. captain takes blame but does he deserve it?

FARMINGDALE, NY — As an accountable leader, Keegan Bradley wants the blame squarely on his shoulders.

Justin Thomas didn't let him. "We needed to make more putts," Thomas interjected when Bradley was asked following the United States' 15-13 Ryder Cup loss to Europe. "That's what Keegan needed. He needed us to make more putts. That's what he needed to do."

Obviously, there is more to the Americans' defeat, the perception of which shifted from embarrassment to valiant comeback effort as they posted 8.5 points during singles matches on the third day.

That ranges from the lineup decisions to the course setup to the fact that Bradley, a veteran player but nowhere near traditional captaincy age, was tabbed by the PGA of America to lead the 2025 squad at Bethpage Black.

Perhaps it was his being left off the 2023 team in Rome that prompted the

PGA to pick him, but Bradley is still playing every weekend on the PGA Tour. To add captain's responsibilities to his plate was unfair, even if Bradley claims this experience changed him for the better and that he wouldn't trade the opportunity for the world.

"I think the goal was to give the captaincy a fresh face, a different way to go about things," Bradley said. "Unfortunately, it didn't work out. But we have

some momentum going forward. I think we can continue down this road, and I'll help out the best I can to help the next captain."

What else is he supposed to say? Bradley became a sympathetic figure in Ryder Cup lore when 2023 captain Zach Johnson — wrongly, many in the golf world said — left him off that team, and the entire thing was captured on the Netflix documentary "Full Swing."

That set the wheels in motion for Bradley to be the likable figure installed as the leader of the 2025 team. Except, Bradley never stopped playing well and would likely have been selected for the squad had anybody else been in charge.

The questions over whether he'd pick himself couldn't have made the preparation for Bethpage any easier. Everybody associated with Ryder Cup USA and the PGA put him in position to succeed, he said, but he "had to learn on the fly."

Bradley definitely missed with some pairings — looking at Harris English and Collin Morikawa going out on back-to-back mornings for a doomed alternate-

shot showing. That Bethpage's infamous rough and difficult playing conditions were neutered to create better scoring outcomes was a misguided choice by the captain, too.

But, as he said, the main culprit for the Americans' defeat was simply that "the Europeans played just incredible golf. Doesn't matter how you set the course up when you play that well."

Bradley said his decision to manure the course in such a way came after digesting information and data about what would best benefit his players. Multiple times this past week, he lamented how soft the greens were. As someone who's played the Black course at Bethpage State Park dozens of times, that perplexed him, and it was at no fault of the grounds crews or weather.

"We thought this was the best way to set the golf course up to win," he said.

Bradley added: "I wish I could have some of those decisions back. I definitely feel I made a few mistakes there, but it's tough to tell that it's going to rain before the Ryder Cup. ... I've got to take responsibility for this outcome for sure."
