ENERGY

The United States federal government should establish a policy promoting renewable energy in the United States, including a market-based instrument.

CORPORATE CONTROL

The United States federal government should substantially expand the scope of liability for anticompetitive practices pursuant to its core antitrust laws.

FDA REGULATIONS

The United States federal government should substantially increase its regulation of food integrity in the United States.

EXECUTIVE POWER

The United States federal government should substantially increase judicial and/or statutory restrictions on the powers of the President in one or more of the following: domestic deployment of the military, immigration, sanctions, tariffs.

FOOD SUBSIDIES

The United States federal government should substantially decrease its domestic agricultural subsidies.

CARBON PRICING

The United States federal government should adopt a domestic climate policy including a carbon pricing instrument.

LABOR

The United States Federal Government should substantially strengthen labor law for workers in the areas of bargaining, right to work laws, and/or organizing.

VOTING AND ELECTION REFORM

The United States federal government should overturn and/or restrict the scope of one or more of the following Supreme Court decisions: Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission, McCutcheon, et al. v. Federal Election Commission, Rucho v. Common Cause, Shelby County v. Holder.

INDIVIDUALS OVER 65

The United States federal government should significantly increase its social services for individuals over the age of 65.

HEALTHCARE

The United States federal government should establish national health insurance in the United States.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

The United States federal government should substantially increase its public health emergency preparedness for infectious disease outbreaks in the United States.

DISABILITY

The United States Federal Government should substantially increase protections for persons with disabilities by amending the Americans with Disabilities Act.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The United States federal government should substantially increase its direct spending on federallyowned hard infrastructure.

NUCLEAR WEAPONS

The United States federal government should substantially reduce the size and/or restrict the roles of its nuclear weapons arsenal.
